Jesus ("God Saves")

Matthew 1:21 *And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name Jesus for He will save His people from their sins.*

Luke 2:21 *And when eight days were completed for the circumcision of the Child, His name was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before He was conceived in the womb.*

All of us at sometime get roped in to naming of babies. Sometimes it's nothing to do with us, but we still put our twopenn'orth in! Mary didn't have to spend long on the subject. Her baby was a completely unexpected miracle, and named by the Angel at the announcement! "Jesus". (Mt 1:21 Lk 1:31). To us who are redeemed, that name has become so precious. The truth is, His name is ordinary. Apparently Spain has quarter million Jesus's! In English the name is simply Joshua, still popular in the UK! Why was Mary's "bundle of joy" given such an ordinary name?

Its meaning: Yeshua/Jesus/Joshua simply means "God Saves". To most, the name is an outward statement of faith of that. For us today, the reason for the name is clear. **Psalm 118:14** *The Lord is my strength and song, And He has become my salvation.*

Actually, its not just the reason for His name, it's the reason for the Baby!

What does it mean for us?

- It means more than organised religion. C.T. Studd said *"If Jesus Christ be God and died for me, then no sacrifice can be too great for me to make for Him"*.
- He saves from the sin that is rightly taking each of us, the people of this world, to hell.
 - ◊He has come to SAVE, not "try to make us good" - we can never be good enough!
 - ◊The Son of God did not come to "bless us" - make our lives easier. He came that we might be "Born Again" to be like Him.
- Jesus means our eternal destination is Heaven, not Hell!

It's no wonder Praise and Worship is the primary function of every blood bought Believer !
